- Learning Strategies: Processes and tactics students employ to aid in the cognitive work of thinking, remembering or learning.
- Self-management Skills: Continued focus on a goal despite obstacles (grit or persistence) and avoidance of distractions or temptations to prioritize higher pursuits over lower pleasures (delayed gratification, self-discipline, self-control).
- Social Skills: Acceptable behaviors that improve social interactions, such as those between peers or between students and adults.

Lesson 1: Listening

Objectives:

- Students will learn that listening enables you to better understand meaning.
- Students will understand that listening is different from hearing.
- Students will understand that listening requires mental concentration.

Lesson 2: Fairness

Objectives:

- Students will understand that fairness is not getting everything everyone else gets; it is getting what you need when you need it.

- Students will review classroom rules and share how they are fair

Lesson 3: Coping Skills

Objectives:

- Students will develop an awareness of their emotions.

- Students will learn the importance of communication when cooperating and how to cooperate better at school and at home.

- Students will learn to make "I" statements rather than "You" statements when discussing a problem.
- Students will learn to take a deep breath to help keep themselves calm and to control their emotions.

- Students will be able to explain what could happen if no consequences were attributed to inappropriate behaviors.

Objectives:

- Students will evaluate their own level of self-respect.

- Students will create weekly plans for eating well, sleeping regularly, and exercising.

- Students will practice using nonverbal cues to communicate.

Lesson 5: Expressing Opinions Constructively

Objectives:

- Students will recognize that it is possible to communicate productively when disagreeing with others.

MODULE TWO: DECISION MAKING SKILLS

Lesson 1: Making Decisions—Big and Small

Objectives:

- Students will recognize that the importance of a decision is determined by its consequences.
- Students will identify factors that influence the decisions they make.
- Students will recognize and use their power to make decisions—even when the decisions are difficult.

Lesson 2: Gathering Information

Objectives:

- Students will practice asking relevant questions in order to gather information and make informed decisions.

Lesson 3: Identifying Options

Objectives:

- Students will recognize that identifying options is an important part of the decision making process.

- Students will practice listening to information and identifying options that are available to them.

Lesson 4: Weighing Options and Consequences

Objectives:

- Students will recognize that weighing options and consequences is an important part of the decision making process.
- Students will practice using a simple method that will help them organize and think about options and consequences.
- Students will evaluate pros and cons in order to weigh options and consequences before making a decision.

Category 2: Behavior Standards - These standards include behaviors commonly associated with being a successful student. These behaviors are visible, outward signs that a student is engaged and putting forth effort to learn. The behaviors are grouped into three subcategories.

- Learning Strategies: Processes and tactics students employ to aid in the cognitive work of thinking, remembering or learning.
- Self-management Skills: Continued focus on a goal despite obstacles (grit or persistence) and avoidance of distractions or temptations to prioritize higher pursuits over lower pleasures (delayed gratification, self-discipline, self-control).
- Social Skills: Acceptable behaviors that improve social interactions, such as those between peers or between students and adults.
